Spring Newsletter – February 2012

We are now coming out of another long, although not too harsh a winter and are getting ready for another season of activity in the Guild. We have a full programme of activity this year with some new venues and meets earlier and later than usual (please see the enclosed 2012 Programme listing)

You will notice that we are starting early in the year with a visit to Grinton on March 11th. This is to offer some support to the flood victims in Swaledale where flooding last year caused great devastation to the walls near the river. We have also contacted the local press and hope to get some positive coverage whilst offering a little bit of help to the affected area (Google 'Grinton Floods' for more information) and will return again on 29th July to continue the work. There is also another new venue at High Knowle Farm, Ilton Nr Masham. This site has undergone some dramatic development over the last 6 months with various sorts of accommodation being built from bunkhouse through to Yurts and Woodland shacks. There is also a café and visitor centre on the site. We will be holding a practice meet there on Saturday 2nd June along with a training course in September. As usual we aim to have at least 2 experienced wallers at every practice meet so if you need any help or advice the instructors can pass on their tips in a 'hands on' environment There is no charge and the events offer a great opportunity to brush up your skills. The atmosphere is very friendly and open to all, including any non-members who may want to try out Dry Stone Walling as a 'taster'. Even if you don't have time to attend for a full day you are still welcome to come along even for a few hours.

We now have a sponsored build on 13th May at Cropper Fold Farm near Bingley which should be more suitable for our members on that side of the county along with our regular sponsored build at West Bolton Farm on 8th and 9th September. These meets are vital income sources for the guild and go in some way to help keeping the membership costs down. The Guild is again most appreciative of Mr and Mrs Langhorne and to Meggan Jeffery and her family for their generous sponsorship.

You will notice there are no maps enclosed this year to cut down on printing costs.
