The revised location and format of our AGM in November appeared to be successful and we were again delighted that our President Bill Cowling was able to be present. The following Committee was elected:



Those present will remember that I thanked the Committee for their sterling work over the past twelve months. In particular we need to thank Woody for his dedication and hard work as both Treasurer and Secretary. He is truly the engine room of the Guild and its increasing success, activity and exposure are in the main due to him.

During 2007 our excellent instructors trained over 40 individuals to the usual high standard at both Thirsk Auction Mart and Fountains Abbey. We will have another useful Instructors Evaluation Day at Masham on 29th March to discuss how things went last year and strengthen the training procedures if this is felt necessary.

You will note that we are running 9 Courses this year; these include courses for Askham Bryan College and FWAG. If you visit our web site you will see

that we now offer gift vouchers for Training Courses that make excellent and increasingly popular gifts for birthdays and the like.

Your Committee has spent a considerable amount of time during the past year considering the **Guild Qualifications**. Following the formal part of the AGM we discussed the proposals for the new Master Waller Test Specification, which met with general approval. The launch of our website has inevitably exposed the Guild and its activities to a much wider and potentially more critical audience and we recognise that we must move forward. We will continue to offer the **Basic Certificate** in its present form, with follow-on certification to a new qualification of **Advanced Certificate** and finally the **Master Certificate**, which will continue to be the highest qualification within the Guild. The Basic qualification will remain free of charge but the attendance expenses of examiners will have to be covered by those candidates attempting the higher qualifications. Hopefully, we can finalise the details at the Instructors Evaluation Day when most of the Guild's 'senior' members will be present. If any member wishes to raise any concern, or improve their understanding of these proposals then please contact either Woody or myself.

You will also note from the Programme that we are attending 8 Shows and have arranged 6 Practice Meets as well as another Sponsored Build in Swaledale. Your Committee has again tried to create a balance between these to spread them geographically and by date.

We always welcome your help and support at these events, please do join us again this year for a good day out in the fresh air and getting some rewarding exercise. The sponsored event is very valuable to Guild funds; everyone attending makes a big difference to the income generated since it is related to the length of completed wall.

The Practice Meets present an excellent opportunity for you to practice walling in a relaxed and friendly atmosphere. They enable you to compare and hone your techniques and skills with other members who will be either more or less skilled than yourself. You might find it useful and interesting to work with the different types of stone at the locations involved.

Shows are always (well nearly always unless the weather is awful!) good fun and do help in the promotion of the craft of dry stone walling. You will meet and talk to interesting people and there is always plenty of time to go round the show itself and spend time with your family. If you do join us then please can I ask you to wear a Guild shirt as doing this does make our appearance more professional and businesslike. We now have a new improved logo for the badge!!
